#1 Call to Order

The regular monthly meeting of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Shiocton for the month of November 2019 was called to order by Village President Terri James at 6:00 p.m.

#2 Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America

#3 Roll Call

Roll call was taken and present were Village President Terri James, Trustees Bunnell, Gomm, Dawes, Winterfeldt and Van Straten. Trustee Schmoock was excused. DPW Corny Van Voorhis, Dan Nabbefeld, Sgt. Sara Knapp, Shay Foxenberg, Chief George, Tom Knorr, Kevin Conradt and Village Clerk Laurie Sweeney.

#4. Acceptance of minutes from previous meeting

Village President Terri James mentioned a typing error. The last minutes referenced "well #q" and it should have been well #1.

#5. Tom Knorr – Trees at Hamlin Park

Tom Knorr made a statement: "I have been advised to make two comments, One, the letter sent should have been sent certified mail because he did not get the letter until recently. Two, please take care of the trees in the village. The third time there is damage won't be able to be considered an act of nature." Tom left after he made his statement.

Village President Terri James stated that the village insurance company recently denied a claim made by Mr. Knorr, stating that the trees looked to be healthy and the damage to his property was an act of nature.

DPW Van Voorhis stated the trees are scheduled to be checked and trimmed in 2020.

#6. Approve amendments made to Ordinance 12-1-1 Shooting Range

Trustee Bunnell explained that the Ordinance Committee is recommending that the range rules be made a village ordinance. There were some changes to update to current law, age 16 or older can be unescorted. The ordinance will be added to the park rules/ordinance.

#7. Approve revisions to Ordinance 3-1-12 and 3-1-11 Bid Solicitation Procedures

The Clerk explained that the current ordinance still has the old amounts for minimum bid requirements. The committee updated the ordinance to read the current state required amounts.

#8. Approve Ordinance 3-1-9(c) Retention of nominal overpayments

The Clerk explained that many municipalities have a policy of not mailing refunds for nominal payments. There are times when residents pay taxes, fines, etc. and the cost to cut a check and mail it is more that the refund. The committee decided to recommend a \$5.00 limit.

#9. Approve Amendment to Ordinance 12-1-1(b)(26) to allow service dogs in village parks The current ordinance reads no dogs allowed in the village parks. This amendment would allow service dogs. Trustee Winterfeldt also mentioned that the road at Lake Park is an actual street so dogs are allowed on the road only.

The current ordinance says the park hours are dusk to 7:00 am and also references the life guards at the swimming lake. The committee just removed the reference to the lifeguards and changed the hours to 10:00 pm to 7:00 am.

Trustee Bunnell explained that the revision updates the ordinance to current state statute and includes wording to not allow them in public buildings, no person can provide electronic smoking devices to a person under the age of 18 and no person under the age of 18 can possess.

#18. Street/Utilities Reports- Director of Public Works Cornelius Van Voorhis

*Van Voorhis reported that the waste water lab had a DNR audit and it went well.

*The new Kubota arrived

* Well #1 is up and running and Speedy Clean started televising, once done they will get a list of repairs that need to be done.

*The library had a sewer back up. The DPW is looking at options for a long-term fix. *The quote for the repairs to the manway on the water tower is \$7,150.

*There is an upcoming meeting that will require DPW Van Voorhis to give them a list of equipment that the village would rent out in case of emergency. The Board would like to check with the insurance company to see who covers the equipment while rented out.

*The Case tractor and garbage truck needed new steer tires.

*All the streets are patched

*Village President James has not heard back from the County about weight limits on the Village streets.

#19. Shiocton Police Department October Activity Report- Chief George

Chief George gave a copy of her 2020 budget to the Board.

Chief George reported that Josh Winterfeldt is starting on his own this week.

Halloween went well. Chief George had some feedback regarding the times. It was suggested that the 5-7pm be changed to 4-6pm so it is not so dark out.

Harassment-3, animal call-10, suspisious-3, traffic safety-2, welfare check-4, ordinance-7, lost and found-4, 911 hangup-5, assist-6, traffic-19, medical-6, damage-1, reckless driver-1, accident-2, fraud-1, disturbance-3, crime prevention-45, motorist assist-1, theft-2, alarm-4, noise-1, trespassing-1, total 65 Chief George had a request from a resident who lives on HWY 54 that wants to duck hunt behind his house when the water is high. After some discussion the Board decided to deny the request. They feel because it is not his property it would be hard to grant him permission and not others that may find out and request the same and they don't want it to get carried away.

#20. Range Report- Chief George

The range is picking up with the upcoming hunting season. Chief George will be doing extra maintenance during the shutdown in November.

Shay Foxenberg presented a statement from the Library Board. She went over the 2020 budget that was approved by the Library Board. Shay showed the Board some of the books that were purchased with the funds from last year.

#24. Clerk- Christmas party The Clerk asked the Board what they wanted to do for a Christmas party. Trustee Winterfeldt mentioned that the December meeting is the same night as the school's chili dinner and concert. The Board decided to not have a party this year due to conflict in schedules.

#25. Public Comment – This is a time for the public to bring up any concerns they would like the Board to address

Kevin Conradt presented a picture of the bridge that Shadows on the Wolf will be installing at the property on Old 54 Rd. They are hoping it will be done by end of year. Shadows also stocked the lake with fish again. There was discussion on making it a rule that only children under 16 and disabled people are allowed to fish the lake. The ordinance committee will look at that.
